

Crash

A Border Patrol agent driving northbound on the west access road accelerated and merged northbound. The vehicle was travelling 100 mph.

At approximately 9:08 a.m., the vehicle exited the highway and continued driving eastbound on Texas Highway 44. Shortly thereafter, the driver lost control of the vehicle and crashed.

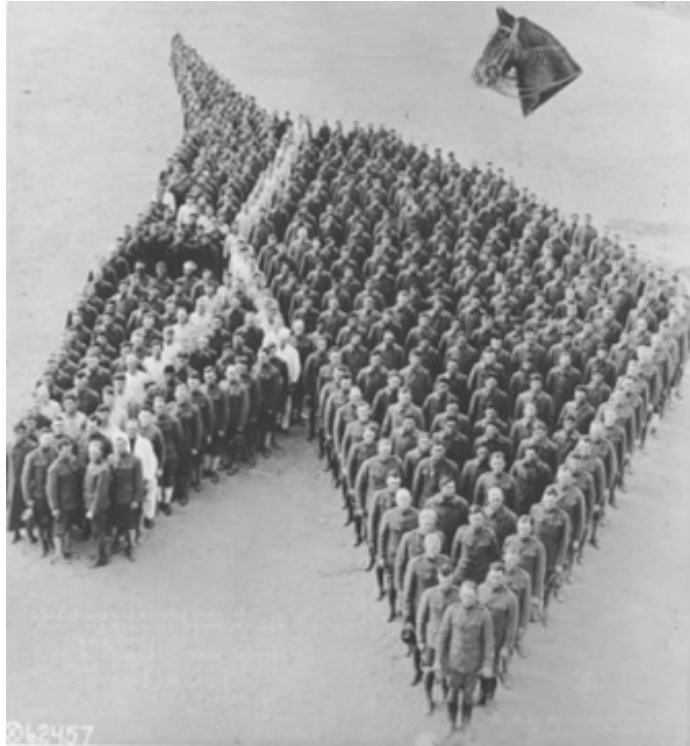
The agent immediately requested emergency medical services and air evacuation support. A short time later, EMS transported the driver to a helicopter landing pad in Freer, Texas.



An unidentified woman initiated a criminal investigation against the driver.

Shooting Near Douglas

On February 19, two Border Patrol agents responded to a remote mountainous area 32 miles northeast of Douglas. Upon their arrival, the Border Patrol agents dismounted their horses due to the terrain. One of the Border Patrol agents fired his service weapon.



The Cochise County Sheriff's Office issued additional details about this incident including information gleaned from interviews of the agents involved.
